Russian Table Diamond. A 68-carat diamond, said by a writer in 1882 to have been among the Russian Crown Jewels. The whereabouts of this stone is unknown today.

Russian Table Portrait Diamond. Also called the Russian Tablet Portrait Diamond, this is a thin flat, irregular pear-shaped diamond that measures 4 x 2.9 centimeters and weighs approximately 25 carats. It belongs to the Russian Treasury of Diamonds and Precious Stones in Moscow. Said to be the largest so-called portrait diamond in the world, it is mounted in an old-Indian gold-and-enamel bracelet, Gothic in style. The stone, which is reportedly of fine quality, is thought to be a cleavage
